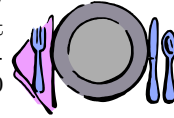

From the Food & Beverage Director

I would like to emphasize how important it is to book your Christmas party early. Some dates have already been booked and if you want a weekend date, it is best to book as soon as possible. Also, Legends is a great place for your small group of 20



to 30 that wants uninterrupted privacy, a separate entrance and dedicated servers and bartenders.

From the Golf Course Superintendent

IN CASE YOU HAVEN'T NOTICED, WE HAVE HAD AN UNBELIEVABLY HOT SUMMER! The combination of triple digit temperatures, high and low humidity, wind and low temperatures in the eighties have all stressed our bent-grass greens. Some greens are stressed more than others, which is evident by the bare thin areas.

CAUSES: There are unique causes for the damage to each green. All the greens suffer when they are kept wet due to the high heat. Then, we get 2 1/2 inches of rain. That excess water blocks oxygen to the already shortened and stressed root system. Rain is great for the fairways, tees and rough, but it is very hard on the older greens with slow sub-surface drainage, especially hole #5.

Holes # 1 and #7 face the south and struggled with the 108 degree day along with a strong south wind. The hot spot on

the golf course, hole #14, suffers from poor air movement.

SOLUTIONS: The best practices to ensure plant health include: raising the mowing height, continuing a sound pesticide program, needle tine aeration and spiking of the greens and providing good water management. The water management program includes a lot of hand watering of the greens. We have begun watering some of the greens after mowing in the mornings to prevent further damage. Given some cooler weather, we will be able to heal all damaged turf and return to normal mowing heights.

FALL AERIFICATION: We plan to begin fall aerification the evening of Sunday, September 18th. We hope to have 9 holes open by Tuesday morning. We are looking forward to the cooler temperatures of the fall and being on our way to recovery.
