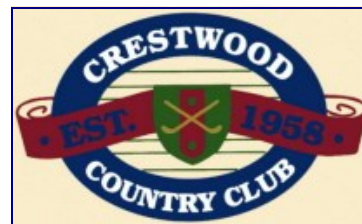

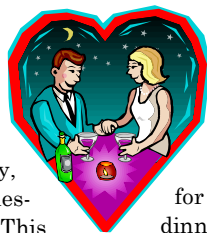
Reservations are a must by Thursday, February 2 for a great time no matter who wins!

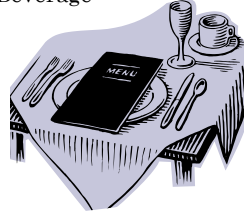

ANNUAL MEETING HELD

The Annual Meeting was held on Monday, January 16, 2012 with approximately 20 members present. The minutes of the 2011 meeting were approved along with the 2011 year-end Treasurer's report. Three new directors were elected by vote of members present and 88 proxies. They are Reggie Moore, Kevin Hall and Jody O'Malley. They will join Mike Cooper, Jolene Remsberg, Todd Loveland, Bill Stobart, Kirk Nelsen and Don Hotz for a three year term.

Two by-law changes were also passed. The first, called Amendment #1, raises from age 35 to age 40 the required conversion from Intermediate to Full Privilege. The second by law referred to as Amendment #2 simplifies the former Non-Resident Level I and Non-Resident Level II into one Non-Resident type that sets the mileage restriction to over 20 miles from club to residence only and not to place of employment.

The new board met following the Annual Meeting for election of officers for 2012. Elected were President Todd Loveland, Vice President Reggie Moore, Treasurer Don Hotz, Secretary Mike Cooper and Assistant Secretary-Treasurer Todd Casey. Greens Committee will be co-chaired by Bill Stobart and Jody O'Malley. The Membership Committee will be chaired by Kevin Hall with Board Member assist. The Social and House Committee will consist of the current Board Members.

ANNUAL REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT

It has been another solid but challenging year in 2011 for Crestwood Country Club. We have worked hard to be the best while still trying to maintain a modest budget in these unsure economic times. We have been working on some exciting building blocks for the future that will ensure CWCC is the place to be in the four state area for golf, dining and good times for everyone.

The reason this year, as in every year, that we are able to be the great club we are is the hard work done by Todd Casey and his staff. Most of us never see all the work that goes into the everyday business and maintenance of the club, but only the perfect outcome. I would like to thank Casey and his staff for keeping the golf course in great shape as well as Tom and his staff for always putting out great food and beverage. Kim and the office staff making sure all checks and balances come out perfect and Todd who does so much and keeps it all running smooth.

I want to give my thanks to my fellow members who have served on the board this year. I would also like to give a special thanks to the board members who have served their terms and will be leaving this year. Past President, Kevin Hamilton and board members Lisa Lusker and David Bastian. Crestwood is a better place since you have sat on this board.

This year as I'm sure all years do came with some problems to solve for the club. We found ourselves needing to spend more on golf course equipment than we had budgeted as the cost of equipment outpaced the income of the golf industry for quite some time now. With the help of Don Hotz and a problem solving board we found a way to make it work. We also made upgrades in the kitchen with some equipment that was badly needed for Tom and his staff. Great efforts were made by Todd and Casey in finding all this equipment at lower costs making it possible for the club to do.

In 2009, the board started the Vision Committee to look at new ideas to solve some of the problems that small clubs like us face in today's changing world. We have seen and heard of many different thoughts about how to insure that CWCC thrives for the future. I believe that all that work for the last three years is about to come to fruition. I believe the members will be thrilled and excited with what I hope is soon to come for CWCC!

It has been an honor and privilege to serve as your President for the past year. Working with Todd and Kim and my fellow board members has been a real pleasure for me. I thank all of you and I can't wait for 2012!!

TREASURER'S YEAR-END REPORT FOR 2011

During the last few years, the economy has taken a great toll on many parts of our society. Private Country Clubs have not been immune to that impact. We have seen the impact not only across the nation but closer to home in the 4 State region. I am proud to report that although the same economy has affected us, we have weathered the storm better than most. Although we have lost members for varying reasons this year, we have added more members than we lost. In addition, this has not been an ideal year for golf. The number of golf rounds has dropped in 2011 which has impacted our food and beverage revenue. We also spent a significant amount of time and energy trying to keep the greens in playable condition as a result of the drought conditions we experienced. Despite all the negative headwinds that we had in 2011, we will end the year with a net operating loss of \$1,067 compared to a net operating profit of \$7,504 in 2010 – a decline of \$8,571. This is still significantly better than our loss of over \$40,000 in 2009.

The largest decline in income during 2011 was in the beverage category which declined over \$8,000. This was directly related to fewer large parties in 2011 and the reduced rounds of golf. Dues and Initiation fees were also down approximately \$8,000 but this was partially offset by lower costs in golf course expenses and administration.

Our income before depreciation was nearly \$80,000 which is the cash that was generated for loan and bond payments and improvements in equipment and facilities. We ended the year with approximately \$18,000 in our bank account and our receivables exceeded our current accounts payable by nearly \$60,000.

The board has been actively pursuing refinancing the existing bonds and debt of \$458,196 and we are pleased to report that we are close to finalizing an agreement that will lower our monthly debt payment while also allowing for flexibility in improving our facilities.

We were able to give raises to employees during 2011 and, even with all the extra time required to maintain the greens and facilities during the year, we still managed to control our spending. The restaurant generated a profit of nearly \$15,000 this year which was slightly better than in 2010.
